

VACCINATIONS AND OTHER TREATMENTS



PUPPIES:

At 6-8 weeks :

- first worming, defleaing and check,
- puppy vaccination ONLY if bottle fed or else at higher risk

At 8 weeks:

- Polyvalente 1

At 11 weeks or 12 weeks:

- Polyvalente 2

At 13 weeks:

- Rabies but it needs to be 8 - 10 days away from all other vaccinations.

Dogs can travel 21 days after rabies vaccination.

Chip and passport can usually be done with rabies vaccination.

Depending on time of the year and circumstances the puppies also need regular spraying with frontline or any other protection for ticks and sandflies

OLDER, FIT PUPPIES

- As above , but they can have their second polyvalente , rabies and chip on the same day if necessary.

ADULTS:

- Polyvalente 1 and 2 with at least 21 days in between,
- Rabies , chip and passport can be done on the same day.

TRAVELLING

Polyvalente 1 + 2 should be finished before travelling (best is at least 5 days before travelling)

Adult dogs in the care of AAR will be given scabbor collars or in some cases, other protection against sandfly and ticks, to be used from around late April until October.

TEST FOR MED: DISEASES:

It is suggested that every dog taken in from around 9 months old should be tested for Leish and also have the 4 x test.

Depending on circumstances a dog found at a younger age could need to be tested as well. (Leish testing before 6 months might show false positive result).
